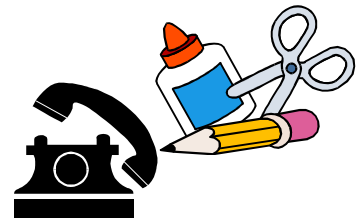

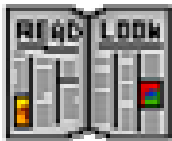


From the Editors Desk.

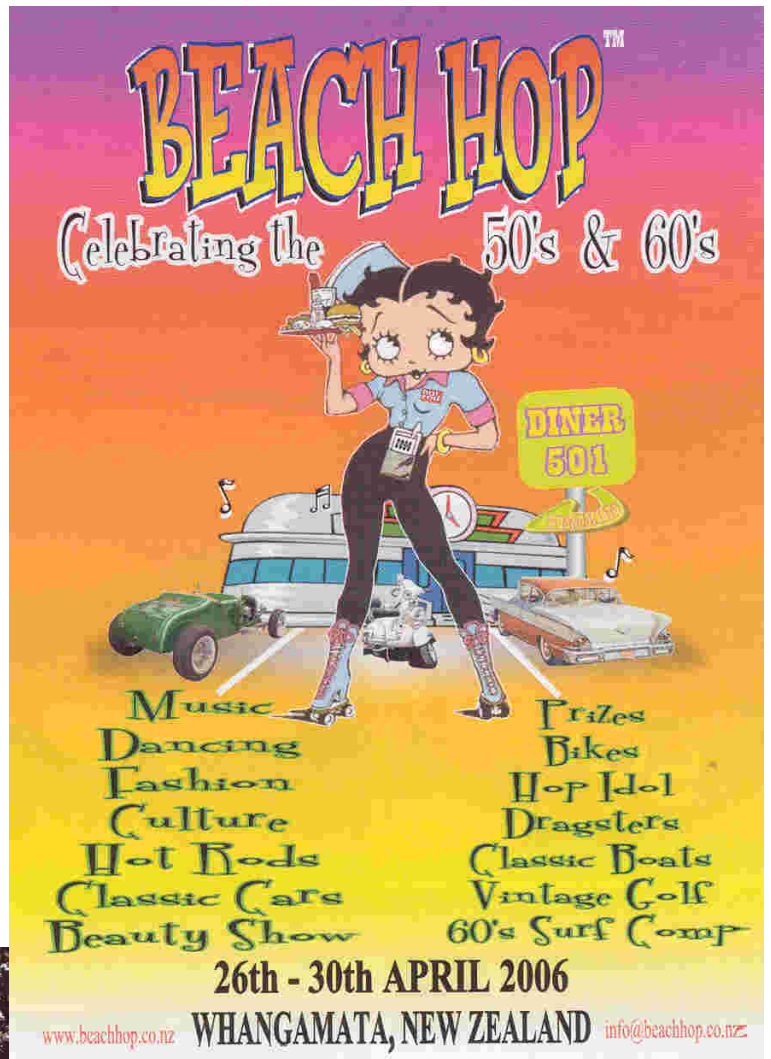

adventurous folk from completing and submitting the answer sheet.

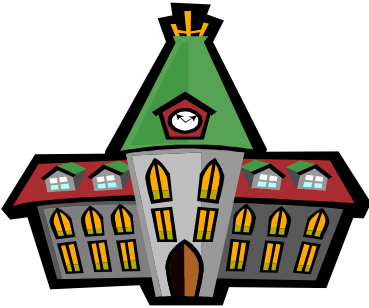
Needless to say they didn't win any prizes. Some of us enjoyed the warmth of the coffee shop before wandering back to look at the

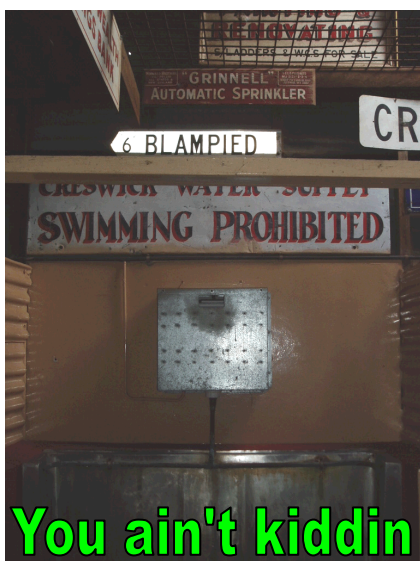

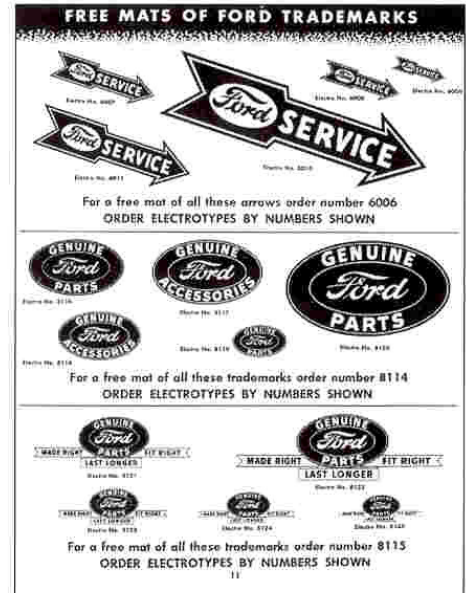

The drawings, completely ready for newspapers to use, made it easy for dealers to look good and mat packages generally included radio spots in 10, 15 and 30 second formats as well. All the dealer had to do was give the radio script to the station, have their readers put it on the air and they were in business.
